The \$14 ruby red slippers in which Judy Garland danced down the yellow brick road in "The Wizard of Oz" fetched \$15,000 Sunday night as Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer continued to auction off its history.

The bidding started at \$1,000, jumped a few times, settled on \$1,000 and finally ended at

\$15,000.

It took less than a minute Sunday night and Richard Wonder, who identified himself as a representative of a "Southern California millionaire," walked off with the dancing shoes.

Wonder, who started the bidding, said he had been authorized by his client to go as high

as \$22,000.


