## ✓ Death cause discovered

SAN BERNARDINO — A man whose blanket-wrapped body was set on fire Sept. 13 on a Yucaipa roadside died from a cerebral hemorrhage and lacerations caused by a blunt object, Deputy Coroner Harvey Castro said.

Castro said Timothy T. Dwight, 26, of Pomona, died "minutes after the injuries were received. It was almost an instant type death and we don't know whether he was killed there or somewhere else."

Castro, however, said it is believed Dwight was dead before his body was set on fire.

Dwight's charred body was found wrapped in a blanket saturated in a flammable liquid on Live Oak Canyon Road, two miles south of Interstate 10. Deputies said his head had been shaved about three days before his death.

On Wednesday Sheriff's Detective Dennis O'Rourke said deputies still have no leads in the case and are asking for information from anyone who might have seen Dwight between Aug. 18, the day he was released from the California Rehabilitation Center, and the day his body was found.

## Mortimer Roloff, Barstow

Mortimer C. Roloff, 55, of Barstow, died Tuesday in Barstow Community Hospital.

A native of Canada, Roloff had lived in San Bernardino County 31 years. He was a retired civil service worker from the Marine Corps Logistics Support Base, Pacific in Barstow.

Roloff was a member of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Barstow Lodge No. 682 F. and A.M., Barstow Shrine, Scottish Rite in San Bernardino, Barstow Elks Lodge and the Order of the Eastern Star of Barstow.

He is survived by his wife, Annette D., daughter Ruth D. Brown of West Germany, brother William C. Roloff of Las Vegas, sister Helen D. Torley of Las Vegas, and two grandchildren.

Services will be 11 a.m. Saturday at Mead Mortuary, Barstow. A private burial service will be Monday in Ontario.

In lieu of flowers, the family requests memorial contributions be made to the Barstow Community Hospital respiratory equipment fund.

## 16-year-old boy dies of wounds

SAN BERNARDINO — A 16-year-old San Bernardino boy died here Wednesday night of stab wounds 3½ hours after he collapsed in a playground area at Waterman Gardens, according to police.

Witnesses said Anthony Kenny (Buddy) Velarde of 1243 Davidson St. was walking toward them when he fell to the ground clutching the side of his chest where he had been stabbed, police said.

Police were summoned just after 6:30 p.m. and the victim was taken to San Bernardino County Medical Center where he died about 10 p.m.

Police said they had no additional details concerning the stabbing and there are no known suspects.
