The owners of a Fairfax district apartment complex were fined almost \$1,600 Tuesday after pleading "no contest" to misdemeanor charges in what prosecutors said was the first conviction under the city's new rent control law.

Abe Hecht and Harry Harari, co-owners of the apartment building at 112 N. Croft Ave., pleaded no contest to three counts each of violating the law.

Alain Rogier, deputy district attorney, said the defendants last November increased rents in two apartments from \$360 per month to \$532.50 per month, claiming it was a "painting fee."

Rogier said the defendants also upped the rent in another apartment after a tenant was evicted.-

#### Judgment against Foxx

A default judgment against comedian Redd Foxx stemming from a alleged pistol whipping of an executive of one of his enterprises was entnered in Los Angeles Superior Court Monday.

The judgment, totaling \$30,000, was signed by Judge Ronald E. Swearinger.

The alleged incident which led to the judgment took place at the office of DDER Manufacturing, Inc., 933 La Brea Ave., on Dec. 2, 1976.

Attorney Ronald Stefen contended Foxx assaulted Heywood Jones, an executive of the now defunct firm that made cosmetics.

A civil lawsuit was filed in Superior Court in March 1977, accusing the comedian of assault.

### Man dies after shooting

A bullet fired from the second floor sun deck of a commercial designer's Van Nuys apartment fatally wounded him as he lay in bed early Tucsday, Los Angeles police reported.

The victim, 39-year-old was with a woman friend when the single shot was fired shortly before 12:30 a.m. at the complex at 13416 Chandler Blvd., said Van Nuys Division homicide detectives.

He was struck in the upper body and died at Riverside Hospital about an hour after the shooting, authorities said.

## Roche to quit county job
